

Teddy walks outside and meets Sperry Sparrow.

**Teddy**: Does he use really bad curse words?

**Teddy:** That's not good! In fact, that's very bad! I'd like to meet this kid, Sperry. I want to find out why

he curses. And I'll encourage him to put those words away in my 'inappropriate language' box.

Teddy waits at the school bus stop. Lots of kids get off the bus.

**Teddy:** Can I talk to you for a minute, BJ Blue Jay. I'm Teddy Bear.

BJ Blue Jay: I...I guess so.

Teddy: Let's sit down here for a minute. I hear that you curse a lot.

**BJ** (defensively): Not when a teacher can hear me.

**Teddy:** I suspect you are angry about something, and cursing makes you feel better.

**BJ:** You're right, Teddy. I am really, really mad at my Dad. He just flew off and left my Mom and me alone.

**Teddy**: BJ, does expressing your feelings by cursing make you feel better?

**BJ:** Yes . . . in way. I can use words that other kids aren't allowed to use.

**Teddy**: Maybe you are showing off. Maybe instead of cursing, you can do something helpful that other kids don't do.

**BJ** (*excitedly*): I really want to be a patrol.

**Teddy:** Talk to your teacher and find out how you can become a patrol.

BJ: I'll do that tomorrow.

**Teddy** (opens a box): And please put all your curse words in this box here and now.

**BJ** (reads the label on the box): Inappropriate Language

**Teddy**: Read the label on the other side.

BJ: Offensive Language. What does that mean?

**Teddy**: The definition of *to curse* (verb) or *a curse* (noun) is to use offensive language when you are angry or annoyed.

**BJ:** What's offensive language?

**Teddy**: Words that hurt your feelings. Words that hurt another person's feelings. So you can dump all your offensive words, curse words into this box.

**BJ**: Oh, I didn't know all that.(*spits curse words into box*) Thank you, Mr. Teddy. I feel lighter and better already.

Sperry Sparrow hops by.

**Teddy**: Hey, Sperry, come over here. Look at all the words in this box.

**Sperry:** It looks like it's full.

**Teddy**: Yes, BJ put all his curse words in here.

**Sperry:** I'm glad that I won't have to listen to him cuss on the school bus anymore.
