

Bird: Two.

Cat: Four.

Ladybug: Six.

Spider: Eight.

Teddy (*cheers*): Two legs, two legs, two legs, two. We appreciate two-legged birds like you. Two legs, two legs, two legs, rah, rah, rah!

Spider: Teddy, many thanks to you.

Teddy: It's sunny today. Let's have a contest.

Spider: I have eight legs, so I will win.

Ladybug: I have six legs and two wings, so I will win.

Cat: I have four legs and a tail, so I will win.

Bird: I have two legs, two wings and a tail, so I will win.

Teddy: Here's the contest. It's sunny, so find your shadow. Show me your shadow. Show me all your shadow legs.

Spider: I'm good at making webs, but not at finding shadow legs.

Ladybug: I'm good at flying in my spotted, red coat, but not at finding shadow legs.

Cat: I'm good at running and pouncing , but not at finding shadow legs.

Bird: I'm good at flying and getting around, but not at finding shadow legs.

Teddy: So we cannot have a shadow contest. You each have an excuse why you can't find your shadow. I wonder if you are afraid of your shadow. (*Teddy moves to a sunny spot*) I have four legs and two good eyes for observing and I CAN find my shadow legs. Look!

Spider: I can see your four shadow legs, Teddy. (*moves to a sunny spot*) Look at my shadow. There are my eight legs.

Ladybug: I can see your shadow legs, Teddy. (*moves to a sunny spot*) Look at my shadow! I have six shadow legs now.

Cat: I can see your shadow legs, Teddy. (moves to a sunny spot) Look at my four shadow legs!

Bird: I can see your shadow legs, Teddy. (*moves to a sunny spot*) Look at my shadow. I have two shadow legs.

Teddy: You are all the best! You all won the shadow contest! In the sun, the shadows come. Two, four, six, eight! Who do we appreciate? Two-legged Bird, four-legged Cat, six-legged Ladybug, eight-legged Spider! Rah, rah rah!
